### **Lake Superior Water Levels Public Information Session**

In response to numerous enquiries about this year's very low Lake Superior water levels, the Lakehead Region Conservation Authority has arranged for representatives of the International Lake Superior Board of Control to attend a Public Information Session in Thunder Bay.

"This will provide an opportunity for shoreline residents to learn about the reasons for the current Lake level conditions, what actions are possible and what the Lake levels may be in the future from the responsible agencies," says Bill Bartley, Chairman of the Lakehead Region Conservation Authority.

The information session will be held at the Oliver Road Recreation Centre (563 Oliver Road) on Wednesday, June 27, 2007 from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Presentation will begin at 7:00 p.m. with questions and discussion to follow.

The Lakehead Region Conservation Authority is a community-based environmental agency. We are responsible for the wise management of renewable natural resources in our watershed. Conservation Authorities undertake a broad range of programs, including: flood control; floodplain management; wetland protection; erosion control; reforestation; conservation lands; and conservation education.
