**WATERSHED CONDITIONS BULLETIN**

***LAKEHEAD REGION CONSERVATION AUTHORITY  
WATERSHED CONDITIONS BULLETIN***

Between 47 and 80 millimetres of rainfall has been recorded at area gauges over the last 48 hours. An additional 5 to 10 millimetres is expected in the next 24 hours.

In the City of Thunder Bay the Neebing-McIntyre Floodway began diverting flood flows on Thursday evening and is expected to continue to divert flows for the next few days. After yesterday's rainfall, most area watercourses have crested and are expected to start to recede; however, the Kaministiquia River is expected to rise throughout the day.

The threat of localized ponding and flooding exists in low lying areas. The public are advised to exercise caution in and around area waterways.

Authority staff will continue to monitor the situation and will issue updates as applicable.

Bulletins are issued to advise of flood safety or watershed conditions.
