***LAKEHEAD REGION CONSERVATION AUTHORITY  
WATERSHED CONDITIONS BULLETIN***

A disturbance will bring rain over the next 48 hours. Rainfall amounts over this period could total between 40 to 50 mm.

Given the forecast, we expect a significant rise in rivers and streams throughout the watershed. The recent spring melt has saturated the soils and rivers and streams are already at elevated levels. The Neebing/McIntyre Diversion Channel will likely divert flows during this event. The threat of flooding exists in low lying areas from heavy downpours due to thunderstorms.

The public are advised to use extreme caution around area waterways and ditches. Parents are encouraged to discuss the hazards of flooding and fast flowing water with their children.

Authority staff will continue to monitor the situation.

Bulletins are issued to advise of Flood Safety or Watershed Conditions. This Bulletin is in effect until 3:00 pm on Friday April 25, 2008, unless conditions change.
